

CUTTING THE RIBBON: *Webster's New Highway Facility*

In April, the Town of Webster cut the ribbon on the new Highway Department Facility on Picture Parkway. The initial planning for the new Webster Highway Facility began in the Fall of 2021 and is a portion of a larger capital project for the Highway campus, which included the acquisition of eight acres in 2021 to bring the campus up to approximately twenty-eight acres, as well as the future planned new truck wash station and salt barn.

The construction of the new facility was completed in early 2025 and was months ahead of schedule and under budget.

At the ribbon cutting, it was unveiled that the new facility will be named the Barry A. Deane Highway Facility in honor of the past Highway Superintendent and Town Councilman. Barry served the Webster Highway Department in several positions for nearly forty years, beginning in 1971. He served the department as Superintendent from July 1992 through his retirement in 2008. In 2010, Barry started his tenure as a Town Councilman, serving Webster for twelve years in this capacity. Throughout his service, Barry was a strong

This new facility includes proper and safe storage and maintenance of the Highway Department's fleet, in addition to updated administrative areas and staff facilities to support staff delivering essential services to the Webster community. The Webster Highway Department is responsible for the maintenance of over 128 miles of Town roads, nearly 400 lane miles of roadway within the Town, and all drainage. The Department also offers several quality-of-life services to residents,

WREATHS ACROSS AMERICA

Webster chapter ranks at the top—again

When volunteer Location Coordinator Cherie Wood first introduced Wreaths Across America to Webster in 2022, it was simply a way to remember veterans resting Webster Union Cemetery. That first year, 660 veteran wreaths were ordered from Maine, and arrived by 18-wheeler. Webster Police gave the truck a police escort through town to the cemetery.

Now in their fourth year, Wreaths Across America Webster has grown to honoring 2,500 veterans resting in five Webster cemeteries: Webster Union, Webster Rural, Union Hill, Holy Trinity, and West Webster cemeteries. The process remains the same. Throughout the year, \$17 veteran wreaths are sponsored, usually by family members and businesses, in hopes every Webster hero may receive this remembrance.

In 2024, Wreaths Across America in Webster ranked #2 out of 174 participating towns in New York State. Webster was in the top 2% out of 6,621 towns nationwide. Because of this honor, Location Coordinator

Cherie Wood was invited to Wreaths Across America's Stem to Stone event in 2024. There she was able to gather ideas from Location Coordinators from around the country, and watch veteran wreaths being made. She heard from Gold Star families who had lost a child in active duty. Holidays are particularly hard on these families. Without their child, everything, including holiday traditions, change. Participating in the Wreath Day ceremony, and placing veteran wreaths has brought healing.

For every \$17 sponsored veteran wreath, \$5 comes back to a non-profit the Location Coordinator chooses. Cherie chose Blue Star Mothers ROC NY8 (Military families), and Gold Star Mothers Rochester (Who lost a child in active duty). The Blue Star Mothers use the wreath money to fill and ship hundreds of care packages to our locally deployed service members. The Gold Star Mothers use their wreath money to care for veterans-in-need from our community. Holy Trinity Cemetery uses their \$5 back to purchase warm coats for children in




need. In total, Wreaths Across America gives \$12,500 back to the Webster community.

Another way veteran wreaths are sponsored is through the Webster Garlic Fest. **The festival is September 6-7** this year, and benefits Wreaths Across America Webster, Blue Star Mothers ROC NY8, and Gold Star Mothers Rochester.

Like previous years, our sponsored veteran wreaths will arrive in December by 18-wheeler and receive a police escort through Webster. Each wreath represents a fallen Webster veteran.

This year, Wreath Day is Saturday, December 13th. The Military Ceremony will be held at Webster Union Cemetery (345 Webster Road) at Noon. The date and time are significant. At noon on December 13th, wreaths will be placed on the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier. Every participating cemetery across the country, and in foreign battlefields, will hold their ceremonies at this

time. About 1,000 Webster volunteers gather with their families for the military ceremony to honor our heroes, and this year they plan to place 2,500 veteran wreaths in the five Webster cemeteries. For many, this has become a family tradition.

How can I get involved?

There are still hundreds of fallen veterans who need to be honored with a wreath. Many of our oldest veterans from the Revolutionary War, Civil War, and the World Wars, no longer have family to remember them. On National Wreath Day, we, the Webster community, become their family.

There are three ways to help: Sponsor a veteran's wreath for \$17. Help place the 2,500 veteran wreaths on National Wreath Day, December 13th. Attend the Webster Garlic Fest, September 6-7 (WebsterGarlicFest.com). If you are interested in helping or have questions, email: WebsterWreaths@icloud.com.

The Town of Webster is grateful for Wreaths Across America as they encourage community participation in honoring veterans. We are proud of the state and national recognition they have received in leading these efforts in Webster.





2027 REVALUATION: What to expect now and in the future

The Town of Webster is entering into its first townwide revaluation, or reassessment, project in over twenty years. Revaluations are so often met with skepticism, misunderstanding, and anxiety; however, this is usually unnecessary. The fear and/or anger comes from a false premise that an increase in a property's assessed value and/or the tax rate will necessarily cause residents' tax bills to increase.

To best understand how the 2027 revaluation will impact the Webster community, it is important to first understand what revaluations are and why they are important.

What is a revaluation?

During a reassessment, the assessor (or a hired contractor) will review the market values of all of the properties in the community. Based on changes in the real estate market, the assessor will determine which assessments need to be increased or decreased.¹

Why are revaluations important?

Webster's last assessment was in 2004. The Town of Webster, as well as the cost of living, has changed significantly over the last two decades.

After several years without a reassessment, some properties will be over-assessed and some will be under-assessed. This is because some properties will have increased in value more than others. Without a reassessment, all of the properties will continue to pay the same share of taxes.

How will a reassessment impact my tax bill?

A reassessment does not mean that a property's assessment or tax bill will automatically increase. In fact, property taxes could even stay the same or decrease. Understandably, the most common concern when a municipality undergoes a revaluation is how the

reassessment will impact residents' tax bills. A common fear and misunderstanding is if a property's assessment increases, the tax bill for that property will increase by a similar amount. Some may even worry that their property's assessment will double, therefore doubling their property taxes – this is not the case.

On the following page, Figure 1 illustrates a probable scenario for many homeowners in Webster. The scenario shows that, although the property's assessment has doubled, the property taxes have stayed the same.

How is it possible that a tax bill could stay the same when the assessment has doubled? In this scenario, the equalization rate was reset to 100% therefore the tax rate decreased by half. It is important to note that there are many factors that go into a revaluation and subsequent tax bills including

While assessed value and tax rate are important parts of the equation that calculates tax bills, they are not the sole determinants of whether a property tax bill increases, decreases, or stays the same after a revaluation.

The Office of the Assessor is responsible for assessments, and not for taxes. Taxing bodies, like Webster Town Board, set their organization's budget and determine the amount of money that needs to be raised from taxes – this is the tax levy. Simply put, tax levies are determined separately from assessments, but are set and applied over all taxable properties in a municipality.

The biggest threat to a property owner's tax bill increasing annually is if the taxing jurisdiction increases its tax levy. Guide rails put into place by New York State beginning in 2012 make it difficult for Town Boards to increase

the tax levy year-over-year by more than 2%. It can be done, but it needs a supermajority—a 4-1 or 5-0 vote for the Town of Webster—on the budget by the Town Board. Since 2012, the Town of Webster has only exceeded the New York State tax cap formula once for the 2016 budget.

What if I disagree with my reassessment?

Several opportunities will be given to ask questions to KLW or the Webster Office of the Assessor about your property's reassessment.

In early 2027, after the Full Disclosure Notice – or notice of a property's new assessment – is received, residents may participate in the Informal Review process. Through this process, taxpayers may meet with the Assessor's Office and/or representatives with the Town's consultant, KLW Group, to discuss their proposed new assessment.

In addition, property owners have the opportunity to grieve their assessment before the Board of Assessment Review (BAR), a quasi-judicial body. The BAR hears all

property review grievances. This is a property owner's second opportunity to challenge their proposed assessment. The formal grievance filing deadline will be May 25, 2027.

Finally, property owners may file Small Claims or Tax Certiorari proceedings through New York State Supreme Court. This is a property owner's final chance to appeal their proposed new property assessment.

How can I learn more?

The Town of Webster wants to be a trusted partner through the revaluation process. The Town, along with KLW, will be hosting several opportunities to meet with taxpayers and share important information throughout the next two years.

We encourage property owners to reach out with any questions so we may work with our community to best educate property owners on this process and its impact.




JULY 2025

July 22, the Town of Webster will officially kick off the Revaluation with a Community Meeting and Q&A in the **Community Room at Webster Public Library**.

FALL 2025

Exemption Workshop: Though not directly related to the revaluation project, the Town of Webster will host an exemption workshop where Assessment Office staff members will work with residents to explore and apply for exemptions they are eligible for.

Data Verification: The Town's consultant, KLW Group, will mail notice on how to participate to residential property owners to ensure the accuracy of the property inventory before valuation.

2026

Valuation Production: KLW Group will use the verified property inventory to produce an estimated full market value for each property throughout the Town of Webster.



EARLY 2027

Informal Review: After the Full Disclosure Notice – or notice of a property's new assessment – is received, residents may participate in the Informal Review process.

Through this optional process, taxpayers may meet with the Assessor's Office and/or representatives with the Town's consultant, KLW Group, to discuss their proposed new assessment.



MAY 2027

Tentative Assessment Roll: Filed (published for public review) on or before May 1 annually, the Tentative Assessment Roll reflects the assessment and exemption changes to all properties, as well as changes in ownership and property size compared to the prior Final Assessment Roll. This will reflect changes made during the Informal Review process.



MAY – JUNE 2027

Grievance: The Board of Assessment Review (BAR), an independent, quasi-judicial body, hears all property review grievances. This is a property owners' second opportunity to challenge their proposed assessment.

Grievance filing deadline will be May 25, 2027 through the Assessment Office.

JULY 2027

Final Roll: Filed (published for public review) on or before July 1 annually the Final Assessment Roll differs from the Tentative Assessment Roll only in the matters approved by the Board of Assessment Review, or other higher legal authorities.



JULY 2027

Monroe County Small Claims Assessment Review/Certiorari:

Property owner's last opportunity to challenge new assessments. Lawsuits are filed with New York State Supreme Court. All property owners have the opportunity to challenge assessments through higher authorities.

Participation in grievance is required.

Filing deadline will be July 31, 2027.

2027 – 2028

The Results: The impact of the 2027 revaluation will be first seen on the following tax bills:

- September 2027 School District tax bill
- January 2028 Town/County tax bill
- June 2028 Village tax bill (if applicable)

How can I participate in the Comprehensive Plan process?
