

Sandbar Park Progress





The Town of Webster has been very active on the Sandbar Park revitalization project with significant milestones reached over the past several months.

As construction in this area continues, we ask for your cooperation and assistance in keeping it a safe environment for the residents, business owners and construction workers. Here are several of the milestones thus far:

- Sandbar Park closed to the public April 18, 2022.
- A groundbreaking ceremony took place on April 26, 2022. Representatives from various agencies from New York state, Monroe County, and the Town officially broke ground on the Sandbar Park Expansion and Improvement Project.
- Removal of selective trees and overgrown vegetation on both sides of Lake Road. The design plans for Sandbar Park include the re-planting of numerous trees and plants to enhance the natural location.
- Removal of Bayside restaurant. The Town completed the Expression of Interest process for potential restaurant operators.
- One lane operation of Lake Road. Lake Road has been limited to one lane traffic in the Sandbar Park section only. Local businesses on Lake Road located West of Sandbar Park remain in operation during the construction. The road work has a completion date of November 1, 2022, at which time the road will be paved and striped for traffic.

The Town is excited for the improvements to the Sandbar Park area, and we are eagerly looking forward to having an attractive destination for all of Webster to enjoy.

Facility Concept Plan Completed

Highway Department's Evolution as it Serves Our Growing Webster Community

The Town of Webster Highway Department has operated out of its current facility, located on Picture Parkway off Hard Road, since 1969. The original 12-stall garage with two mechanics bays, a state-of-the-art paint booth, parts storage, break room, locker rooms and administrative offices was sized for the 18 staff members and 12 trucks that existed at that time. Through meticulous upkeep and some remodeling by the multi-trade craftsmen who have worked at the department over the years, the building is still in use today, despite the department's growth to more than twice that number of staff and trucks.

The evolution of the facility to what it is today has involved several expansions and additions over the years. Within the first 10 years, a pitched roof had to be added because of excessive leaks in the original flat roof. In the 1980s the existing salt storage barn was added. In the 1990s the Clifford E. Jones Building was added, as well as 4 additional truck stalls to the main building. As the Town continued to grow in the 2000s the Cliff Jones Building was expanded twice. Since 2010 there has been a third and fourth expansion of the Cliff Jones Building, as well as additions to the Salt Barn to incorporate the storage racks for the removable truck salters. The only thing that has remained constant throughout these expansions is that each one has cost more than the last due to continued increases in material and labor costs.

Despite the many efforts listed above, and several other smaller upgrades over the years, the facility has reached the end of its useful life. In addition to structural deficiencies, the original building lacks adequate space for the now 40 employees (under-sized restrooms, locker rooms, break area and equipment storage). The existing facility and the many additions have been maximized to the fullest potential imaginable. A new facility to house the department staff and large fleet of equipment used to provide clear, safe roadways and proper drainage throughout the Town is needed.

The growth of the department is directly related to the growth of the Town and its population. Since 1980, the Town population has increased by more than 15,000 residents, which has necessitated more than 50 miles of new Town roads as well as new stormwater facilities and drainageways. Currently, there is potential for the Town to grow by as many as another 20,000 residents. The new facility will need to take this into account in order to ensure the essential services that the department provides can continue at the highest level possible for years to come. A feasibility study and concept plan for a new facility on the existing Highway Department campus has been completed. - 404 lane miles of roadway within the Town, including 275 lane miles of Town roads, 105 lane miles of County roads and 24 lane miles of State roads
- Drainage, including 103 water management facilities, approximately 1,100 miles of storm sewers, more than 77 miles of creeks & streams, over 3,000 catch basins

The Department also provides:

- Fall leaf pick-up, townwide
- Mowing, sweeping, paving and chip seal operations for Town, County & State roadways
- Snow & ice removal for Town, County & State roadways

A New Comprehensive Plan

The Webster Town Board recently indicated its support for the advancement of a new Comprehensive Plan to guide future growth and policy initiatives; the last Plan update was in 2008. In the second half of 2022, the Town will begin organizing the Plan update process, which will include the hiring of professional planning consultants, plus extensive public engagement.



What is a Comprehensive Plan?

- Expresses a community's long-term vision, goals and objectives
- Establishes policies and strategies for future growth, development and protection of community assets
- Informs land use regulations and local decision making
- Prioritizes capital improvement and infrastructure projects
- Functions as a basis for updating the Town's Zoning Ordinance and Official Zoning Map

Benefits of an up-to-date comprehensive plan

"Among the most important powers and duties granted the legislature to a town government is the authority and responsibility to undertake town comprehensive planning and to regulate land use for the purpose of protecting the public health, safety and general welfare of its citizens"

NYS Town Law Section 272-a

- 1 - Provides municipal officials with an understanding of historical trends, present conditions, and an opportunity to thoughtfully plan for future growth
- 2 - Provides for a balanced economic and community development strategy based on the community's physical, environmental and social conditions
- 3 - Provides guidance for public and private sector investments
- 4 - Helps attract grant funding opportunities for project implementation

In Honor of

Charles E. Sexton



On April 22, 2022 the Town of Webster officially renamed North Ponds Park the Charles E. Sexton Memorial Park. The renaming of one of Webster's most well-known Town parks was a permanent and meaningful way to remember a man who was dedicated to the Town he served.

Charles served as the Town of Webster's first Recreation Director. He retired in 1996 after 34 years of service to his community. Charles was a US Army Veteran and longtime member and volunteer at Holy Trinity Church. Charles was a tremendous figure in the community who worked tirelessly for the residents of Webster and this honor will ensure his legacy of service and commitment are never forgotten.

The Town entrusted Charles to start a recreation program that has stood the test of time. The first programs were offered to the community in 1962 and today's department continues to expand on the foundation and vision that he created. Many of the early programs started by Charles are still in operation including senior


activities, youth summer camps and fitness programs. The creation and development of North Ponds Park was a significant highlight for Charles and one area that provided him with great pride and importance.

The Town held a ceremony to recognize the official name change and the community response was indicative of the impact Charles had on the community. The park was full of friends, former coworkers, former employees, and family members from as far as California. As the speakers shared their own stories about Charles, it was clear that each person had been influenced in a different way by him, and they were all better people for having worked for and with him.

A new sign has been installed at the park's entrance to celebrate the new name. In time, the community will gain a familiarity with the new name and North Ponds will become part of the past. The Charles E. Sexton Memorial Park will be recognized as the destination-park of Webster.

The goal is to release our first newsletter before our Fall Programs begin, sometime in August of 2022. In the meantime we are looking for you to sign up!



About Us

Friends of Webster Trails (FWT) is a non-profit 501(c)(3) organization enthusiastically serving as the volunteer arm of the Webster Parks and Recreation Department. FWT was established in 1997; our only activity was to maintain the Hojack Trail. With the Town's acquisition of open space, FWT has now built 20+ miles of trails in the Whiting Road Nature Preserve, Gosnell Big Woods Preserve, Four Mile Creek Preserve and other properties. These trails provide a place to hike, cycle, run, cross-country ski, and snowshoe.

What We Do

Build Trails

FWT relies on volunteers! Trails are monitored by Trail Stewards who take care of light maintenance. Bigger jobs and improvements are addressed at our monthly workdays during the warmer months. As new properties are being acquired by or donated to the Town, FWT is there. We clear brush and work the land to provide a safe path. In many instances there is need to build structures such as walkways, bridges, kiosks, benches, and platforms. FWT also coordinates with our local Boy and Girl scouts, with financing scout projects and offering guidance as required.

Fight Invasives

We have a Habitat Committee whose maintenance work includes working to remove non-native, and invasive plants. The committee identifies issues, conducts research, provides guidance, and proposes solutions.

Plan for the Future

FWT established the ReTree program which aims to maintain, restore, and add to our forested areas. Kicking off in 2022 our Re-Tree Program has built a nursery for seedling trees!

The Role of Engineering in the Town of Webster

Welcome to the Engineering Department at the Town of Webster!

This department is managed by NYS licensed engineer and Town resident, Mary Herington. In addition to the Town Engineer, the department currently staffs an Engineering Assistant and a shared Clerk with the Department of Community Development. The department will be growing soon by filling two positions, the vacant technical assistant position and recently posted position of Assistant Town Engineer.

You may be asking yourself, what is the role of the Engineering Department for the Town of Webster? The main functions of the department include but are not limited to: Implementing the Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System (MS4) program; New Development Review and Inspection; Capital Project Management and Review; Geographic Information Mapping (GIS); Records and Mapping for Developments, as well as processing Fill and Excavation permits. Besides these main functions of the department, we also work with other departments (Sewer, Highway, Parks and Recreation and Library) in collaboration for Town projects including maintenance and improvement of the Town Buildings.

To provide greater context to the role of Engineering, further explanation of some of the department's responsibilities are below:

Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System (MS4) program

The MS4 program is a requirement of the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (NYSDEC) and focuses on maintaining and improving the waterways within a community. This means protecting creeks and streams from construction runoff, ensuring pollutants are not entering the storm sewer system via runoff (such as fuel spills mixing with rainwater) or cross connections (for example, sanitary connected to storm sewer), maintaining stormwater ponds and filtration systems and keeping diligent records of

the program requirements. The boots-on-the-ground maintenance is supported by our talented Highway Department.

New Development Review and Inspection

New development, whether commercial, industrial, or residential, is reviewed by Town departments, including Engineering. The Engineering Department reviews these projects for adherence to standards, utility design, storm water design, constructability, and the ability to maintain the proposed. This review occurs prior to construction, and during, when the Engineering Department performs onsite inspections for storm sewer installation, road construction, building connections to sanitary and storm sewers, and overall grading conformance.


Capital Project Management and Review

Distinctive photos of West Webster schools, churches and historic properties with accompanying history will pique the community's interest and bring back fond memories for some. All exhibits will be in place until November.



The Town of Webster is seeking to strengthen the identity of the West Webster Hamlet as a neighborhood center. In late 2021, the Town was awarded transportation planning funds to be used toward the development of a revitalization strategy for portions of the community centered on the Hamlet Four-Corners at Ridge Road and Gravel Road. Secured by the Webster Economic Development Alliance on behalf of the Town, financial assistance for the Study is being provided by the Federal Highway Administration and Federal Transit Administration through the Genesee Transportation Council.

The results of this \$100,000 planning effort will identify recommendations to strengthen the Hamlet's sense of place, identify improvements for transportation and pedestrian safety, increased connectivity, and the promotion of sustainable development along both Ridge Road and the adjacent Empire Boulevard corridor.

The planning process began in March 2022 with the hiring of Ingalls Planning & Design as lead urban planning consultants to facilitate strategy development. The 12-month process includes several opportunities for public engagement, including citizen advisory group meetings, public open house sessions, and an online Public Engagement website. More information on future engagement opportunities will be distributed throughout 2022.


